Synopsis of Book

This picture book, by Doug Kuntz and Amy Shrodes and illustrated by Sue Cornelison, is the incredible true story of a cat who was separated from his family while escaping the war in Iraq in 2015. After a journey across Europe and the help of many kind people, Kunkush reunites with his family. The story highlights the issues of refugees, especially in war zones and the strength and love of family.

Using the Reading Trek in Class

- 1. Introduce the book to the whole class on an interactive whiteboard using the Reading Treks map.
- 2. For younger students, read the book to the class. Have older students read it themselves.
- 3. Have students research more about the book using the Reading Trek as a webquest.
- 4. In each layer, have students explore the cities, countries, and places, including culture, history geography, and climate. Then report with a whole class chart or individual presentations.
- 5. Explore animal rescue organizations locally and nationally. Discuss why people volunteer to help animals.
- 6. Discuss why people like to have pets. Have students write about pets they have owned or would like to have. Include photos, if possible.

Additional Activities

- 1. Using the map, have students trace the journey and figure the mileage for the trip by car, the trip by boat, and then the travel across Europe.
- Discuss immigration by having children explore their family's history. Students can ask their families
 about the stories of their ancestors that came to the U.S. Create a classroom <u>Google My Maps</u> of the
 origins of your students around the world and in the U.S.
- 3. For older students, use the map to research and discuss where refugees are found in the world and why. As a whole class or in small groups, have students create a <u>Google My Maps</u> or use charts or Google Spreadsheets to organize the research.
